Introduction-NET

- The UGC (NET) Humanities is conducted by the University Grants Commission.
- The UGC(NET) Test will determine the eligibility of Indian National candidates for the award of Junior Research Fellowships and for appointment of Lecturers in Universities and colleges in the subjects falling Humanities (including languages), Social Sciences, Forensic Science, Environmental Sciences, Computer Science and Application and Electronic Science.
- The UGC (NET) Humanities Test comprises of 3 papers. UGC conducts NET twice a year i.e. in the month of June and December.
- The MULTINATIONAL-UGC (NET) package has been designed with a view towards generating supreme confidence for success at the UGC (NET) Test.
- MULTINATIONAL-UGC (NET) course is also useful to prepare for State Eligibility Test (SET/SLET) of various States.

Eligibility – NET

- (i) Candidates who have secured at least 55% marks (50% marks for SC/ST/PH/BL) without grace or rounding off in Master's Degree or equivalent examination in Humanities (including languages) and Social Sciences, Computer Applications, Electronic Sciences etc. are eligible for this test.
- (ii) Candidates who are in the final year or have appeared for Master's degree or equivalent examination can also apply for the test. However, such candidates will be considered eligible for JRF/LS only after they have passed the Master's Degree examination or equivalent with at least 55% (50% marks for SC/ST/PH/BL) marks. These candidates must submit their P.G. Mark sheet within two years of the declaration of the result of NET exam.
- (iii) The Ph.D. degree holders whose Master's level examinations were completed by 19th September, 1991 (irrespective of date of declaration of result) shall be eligible for relaxation of 5% of marks(i.e from 55% to 50%) to appear in NET Examination.
- (iv) Candidates have to appear in the subject of their Post Graduation only. The

candidates whose PG subjects is not covered in the list of subjects provided by UGC, may appear in the subject related to the one they had at PG.

(III) EXEMPTION (ELIGIBILITY FOR LECTURESHIP)

1. **For M.Phil/ Ph.D candidates:** NET shall remain the compulsory requirement for appointment as lecturer for those with post-graduate degree. However, the candidates having Ph.D degree in the concerned subject are exempted from NET for PG level and UG level teaching. The candidates having M.Phil degree in the concerned subject are exempted from NET for UG level teaching only. The candidates who have passed the UGC/ CSIR JRF examination prior to 1989 are also exempted from appearing in NET.

2. **For SLET Candidates:** The candidates who have cleared the State Level Eligibility Test (SET/SLET), accredited by the UGC for Lectureship prior to 1st June 2002, are exempted from appearing in the NET Examination. **For SET/SLET examinations scheduled in or after June 2002, the qualified candidates shall be eligible to apply for the post of lecturer only in the university/ colleges belonging to the same state whose SET/SLET Examination they have cleared.** However, those candidates are also eligible to apply for appearing in the NET, if they so desire.

(iv) **Age Limit:** The upper age limit for being eligible for the test is as below:

(a) **For Junior Research Fellowship (JRF):** Candidate should not be more than 28 years on 1-12-2009 for Dec. 2009 Exam and 1-6-2010 for June 2010 Exam relaxable upto 5 years in case of candidates belonging to SC/ST/OBC/PH/BL and women applicants. 3 years relaxation in age will be permissible to the candidates possessing L.L.M. Degree.

(b) **For Lectureship:**

There is no upper age limit.

Scheme of the test

The Test will consist of three papers.

Paper-I will consist of 50 objective type questions of general nature intended to assess the teaching / research aptitude of the candidate. It is designed to test reasoning ability, comprehension and divergent thinking and general awareness of the candidate. Total Marks of Paper-I will be 100.

Paper-II will consist of 50 objective type questions based on the subject selected by the candidate. The candidates will have to mark their response for each question on the answer sheet attached at the end of the test booklet. Total Marks of Paper-II will be 100.

Paper-III will have **four** sections:

Section-1: It requires the candidate to write a critique of a given passage or stanza from a known thinker / writer. Five questions will be asked on this passage requiring an answer

upto 30 words. It shall carry 25 marks (5x5=25). In case of Science subjects, a theoretical problem will be set for the candidates to analyze. The questions will be based on **Paper-III(A)**.

Section-2 : Fifteen questions will be asked on the syllabus of **Paper-III(A)**. The questions are to be answered in upto 30 words each and carries 5 mark each. (15x5=75marks). There will be no internal choice.

Section-3 : Questions will be asked from all electives and candidate has to choose one elective and answer the five questions from it. The questions will be based on **Paper-III(B)**. There is no internal choice. The questions are to be answered in upto 200 words and carries 12 mark each, (5x12=60marks). Where there is no elective, 5 questions will be set across the Paper-III syllabus.

Section-4 : Essay writing- One question with internal choice on general themes, and contemporary, theoretical or of disciplinary relevance to be answered in 1000 words and shall carry 40 marks. The total marks for Paper-III(A) an Paper-III (B) will be 200.

Paper-III will be evaluated only for those candidates who are able to secure the minimum qualifying marks in Paper-I and Paper-II, as given below:

Value of Fellowship

Candidates qualifying for the award of Junior Research Fellowships will be eligible to receive fellowship under various schemes subject to finding their placement in the University / IITs / Other National Organizations. The validity of the offer is one year w.e.f. the date of issue of JRF award letter. However, in case the candidate has already joined M.Phil/Ph.D., the date of commencement of fellowship will be from the date of declaration of examination result. The amount of the fellowship is **Rs.12,000/-** per month at present. The progress of the research work done by a JRF on the completion of two years of the award may be assessed as per the procedure laid down by the Commission. The fellowship may be

withdrawn if the work is not considered satisfactory. The fellowship for the third and subsequent years will be Rs. **14,000/-** per month. Candidates who will qualify the test for eligibility for Lectureship will be governed by the rules and regulations for recruitment of Lecturers of the concerned Universities/Colleges/State Govts. etc. Candidates qualifying JRF shall avail the award within one year from the date of issue of the award letter.

8. POLITICAL SCIENCE

As per the syllabus, there is no separate Electives for Paper III (B) which is combined with Paper III (A). (Syllabus for Paper III A and B are common).
